SMELL, GO, and LET US KNOW!

How to identify a possible gas leak: If you smell a rotten egg or sulfur odor, you hear a blowing or hissing sound, or you see blowing dirt, it could be a gas leak.

What to do: Leave your home and the area immediately. Don't use any electrical device such as a light switch, telephone, appliance or garage door opener. Don't try to find the gas leak yourself.

Who to call: Go outside and use your cell phone or a neighbor's phone and call Fountaintown Gas at (765)763-6393 and we will respond 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Home Heating Assistance Program Notice

The Indiana Energy Assistance Program moratorium ends March 15, 2021. Review your account closely and budget accordingly to allow your account to be brought current prior to the March due date. Any account that has received all pledged Energy Assistance Program funds and has an outstanding past-due balance, may be eligible for disconnection of service as of March 18, 2021.
