CAN WE FIND YOUR HOME IN AN EMERGENCY?

In an emergency, first responders and the Gas Co. depend on clearly marked addresses to find the right property as quickly as possible. You can help by following these steps:

- Replace aging or faded numbers.
- Clear obstructions from blocking your house numbers.
- Post large numbers that are visible from the street.



The Gas Co. continues to work on mapping our entire distribution system. You will see an increased presence of Gas Co. personnel walking our system and locating all underground facilities with flags and paint. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact the office during normal business hours.



Know what's **below. Call** before you dig.

The colored flags and paint markings that you may see on your property or in your neighborhood are put on the ground by your local utility companies to alert excavators and project planners of the approximate location of buried utility lines.

Prior to any excavation project, Indiana State Law, requires a call to 811 at least two full working days prior to beginning any project. Once this call is made, 811 sends a locate request ticket to each member utility in the area of the project. These utilities respond and place colored paint and flags on the ground to let the excavator know the approximate location of these lines. This helps the excavators to avoid damaging buried utility lines, such as our natural gas lines.

Please leave all flags and markings alone; doing so will help excavators dig safely and may prevent an emergency situation which could endanger you, your neighbors, utility employees, and first responders. In addition to being the safe thing to do,

leaving markings alone is the law. Removing these markings can result in a fine.

If you ever have a question about markings, please contact the appropriate utility. And if you see anyone digging and do not see any markings, please call 811.
